GENERAL INFORMATION

As authorized by of Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration, the Panjab University, Chandigarh has been appointed as the Competent Authority to conduct Common Entrance Test and admission will be based on entrance test. The admission is based on merit in Entrance Test only. Merit-based admission to B.Ed. (General), B.Ed. (Yoga) and B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) courses of duration of two academic years for the session 2026-28 in the Colleges of Education affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh and situated in U.T. Chandigarh. The information about Colleges of Education and the number of seats available therein as per approval granted by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), as notified in the Notification of Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration Notification No. E-599728-DHE-UT-C6-26(1)92-IV/ dated 11-05-2026 and Guidelines/General Rules by Panjab University, Chandigarh.

1. ELIGIBILITY:

A candidate who possesses the following qualifications shall be eligible for admissions to join the course:

- a) i) Candidates with at least 50% Marks either in Bachelor's degree and /or in the Master's degree in Science / Social Sciences / Humanities / Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the program. The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favour of the reserved categories shall be as per rules of the Chandigarh Administration.
- b) ii) The reservation on seats and relaxation on the qualifying marks in favour of reserved categories shall be as per the Chandigarh Administration and NCTE.

#These norms are as per Para 3.2 of Appendix 4 of N.C.T.E. Notification F-51/12014-NCTE(N&S) dated 27.11.2014.

Note-i):- Any Candidate with less than 50% or as desired by NCTE as minimum qualifying marks would not be eligible.

Note-ii):- There shall be a relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST candidates. Candidate with less than 45% marks belonging to these categories shall not be eligible.

Provided that such minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a candidate to get admission in an institution but only entitle the candidate concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the Government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

b) Candidate must have studied the major subject of the subject combination for at least three years at Bachelor's level and/or two years at Master's level.

- Honors students shall opt for major subject in which they have obtained Honors, the minor subject should have been studied at least for one year / one semester.
- Candidates who have passed B.A.LL.B /B.Com. LL.B with at least 50% Marks in a relevant school subject.

- A candidate getting admission on the basis of Post Graduate Degree shall have to opt for major subject in which they have obtained Master Degree.
 - Any candidate who has passed graduation even without a relevant school subject would be eligible **only** for B.Ed Yoga and B.Ed Special Education-Intellectual Disabilities) courses.
- c) Candidates who have appeared for qualifying examination and whose results have not been declared may be provisionally allowed to apply for admission at their own risk and responsibility but they shall become eligible for counseling only after they have produced the evidence of having satisfied the above said conditions on the date of counseling.
- d) Candidate Result late (RL)/Re-evaluation/Compartment cases, if their results are declared before final counseling, shall be considered subject to availability of seats only.
- e) In case of students who have done Honors in languages such as Hindi, Punjabi and English, the major subject will be relevant language. Such candidates would be allotted minor subject by the college on the basis of other subject option/s permissible to the candidate with the availability of the same in the respective colleges.

2. **PLACEMENT OF CANDIDATE:-**

- (a) The admission to various Education Colleges of this University & situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh will be done strictly as per norms laid down by N.C.T.E and by the admission committee to be constituted by the University. The mode of admission shall be determined and notified by the University.
- (b) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test (CET), their inter-se merit for admission shall be decided on the following criteria:
- i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in the qualifying examination.
 - ii) Candidate older in age.

3. **RESERVATION OF SEATS**

The RESERVATION POLICY for Chandigarh Colleges is as follows:-

A candidate applying in the Reserved Categories shall carefully indicate his/her claim for category in the Admission Form. **No change of category will be entertained / permitted** in the application form or otherwise at a later stage.

- A. UT Pool 60%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **60% seats** will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their lower qualifying examination from colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said Colleges/ Institutions, subject to the condition that such students must have studied atleast **for two years at graduate level at Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as "UT Pool".**
- B. General Pool 40%:** Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **40% seats** will be filled **from amongst the students who passed their lower qualifying examination from the institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh.** These seats will be termed as **"General Pool". Students who have passed their qualifying examination through distance mode/private will be considered in General pool only.**

❖ **Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes**

The following percentage of seats is prescribed for the students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes:

U.T. Pool:

Scheduled Caste– 15%

Scheduled Tribes– NIL

OBC- 3%

General Pool:

Scheduled Caste– 15%

Scheduled Tribes – 7.5%

OBC- 3%

If the requisite number of students of SC category in the UT Pool is not available, and if the requisite number of students belonging to SC/ST categories in General Pool is not available, the reservation will be interchangeable amongst the students of these communities. However, if the seats still remain unfilled, these will be made open amongst the students of the General category of the respective said-pool.

SEATS RESERVED FOR OBC (NCL) CATEGORY:

- 1) The OBC (NCL) must fulfill relevant eligibility criteria as per the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs Notification, s. o. 3598(E) dated 05.08.2025 extending the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016 to the Union Territory, Chandigarh / U.T. Chandigarh and communicated by The Secretary Social welfare, Women and Child Development, Chandigarh Administration vide Memo Number SWD/RA/OBC-Act/2025/6692 dated 07.08.2025 Chandigarh.
- 2) The candidate shall actually belong to the community claimed.
- 3) His/ Her community shall be included in the list of OBCs issued by the Central Government in respect of U.T. Chandigarh or his/ her community shall be included in central list of other Backward Classes for the Union territory of Chandigarh, forwarded by the social welfare department, U.T., Chandigarh from time to time by notifications order(s).
- 4) **For claiming U.T. Pool OBC seat the person shall belong to Union Territory, Chandigarh.*** Certificate of belonging to Union Territory, Chandigarh issued by the Tehsildar/ Magistrate 1st Class/ deputy commissioner of UT Chandigarh and bearing the seal of issuing authority.
- 5) OBC certificate containing the clause of non-creamy layer (NCL) issued by competent authority of UT Chandigarh.
- 6) Candidate must have claimed his/ her eligibility for OBC (NCL) category while applying online entrance form for B.Ed. course.
- 7) Any seat(s) remaining unfilled from UT Chandigarh Pool and General Pool OBC (NCL) category on account of non-availability of eligible candidates shall be added to UT Chandigarh General Category and General pool general category and will be filled from combined merit list of the entrance test.
- 8) The students belonging to backward class as per the Central list of Other Backward classes for the Union Territory of Chandigarh can avail the reservation;

❖ **Persons with Disability (PwD)**

5% seats in each pool would be filled from amongst the Persons with Disability candidates (1% each to be reserved for persons suffering from (i) Blindness or loss of vision(ii) Hearing impairment (iii) Locomotors disability or cerebral palsy).The students having temporary disability would not be considered against reserved seats. Eligible candidates will furnish a medical fitness certificate on the prescribed proforma from a Government Gazette Medical Officer along with the application indicating percentage of disability whether he/ she is otherwise able to carry on the studies and perform the duties of a teacher, name of the disease-causing disability, whether disability is temporary or permanent, whether disability is progressive or non-progressive. Only such candidates whose disability is above **40% are eligible**. If such a certificate is not attached with the application, the candidate will not be considered for the seats reserved for this category.

The candidates selected provisionally for admission under this category will have to appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Principal Medical Officer, General Hospital, Sector16, Chandigarh, for determining the percentage of disability / disability. The final selection will be made on the basis of the certificate issued by the Medical Doctor/Board. If the candidate does not present himself / herself before the Medical Doctor / Board on the date intimated to him/her, his / her candidature against this category will be rejected and no subsequent opportunity will be given to him/her.

The members of persons with disability including blind and hearing impaired shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks for admission to the courses in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by the regulations. (**Revised Guidelines for Reserved Category of Persons with Disabilities Candidates, No.3500-3599/DUI/Dsdated01/07/2016**)

❖ **Ex-Serviceman, Dependents of Defense/Para-Military Personnel etc.:**

5% of the seats in each pool would be filled in from the following categories of students in order of preference:

- (a) Sons/ daughters / spouses of the defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir / Mahavir / Vir Chakra in person or posthumously OR Sons/ daughters/ spouses of the defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (b) Sons/ daughters/ spouses of the Defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (c) Sons / daughters / spouses of the defense and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (d) Sons/daughters/spouses of ex-serviceman (defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc.) that are wholly dependent on them.
- (e) Sons/daughters/spouses of serving defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are wholly dependent on them.

NOTE:

- i) The applicants seeking admission under categories (a) are required to submit the photo copy of citation for gallantry award, failing which they will not be considered for this category.
- ii) The applicants under category (b) and (c) are required to submit the certificate from the respective headquarters regarding death or total incapacitation while in service.
- iii) The applicants seeking admission to category (d) are required to submit discharge certificate from service and certificate of dependence from the **Director, Zila Sainik Board.**
- iv) The applicants claiming admission under category (e) are required to submit the certificate of dependence from the unit in which parent/spouse is serving.

❖ **Children and Grand Children of Freedom Fighters**

2%seats from each pool will be filled from the children and grandchildren of freedom fighters.

- (a) A freedom fighter is a person who has either been granted freedom fighter pension by the Chandigarh Administration or has been awarded "Tamra Patra" by Government of India for his political sufferings. No person other than the above-mentioned persons will be considered as freedom fighter for the purpose of reservation in admission. The requisite certificate will be issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh, which will be considered irrespective of the form in which it is issued, provided it is self-explanatory.
- (b) Grand children mean son's sons/daughters or daughter's sons/daughters.
- (c) The wards of freedom fighters who have been awarded "Tamra Patras" by the Government of India would also be eligible for reservation under this category. In the case of such freedom fighters, they should produce their "Tamra Patras" certificate, freedom fighter certificate and dependence certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the district in which they reside.

NOTE: The applicants from this category will not be considered without the following documents:

- i) The photocopy of "Tamra Patra" certificate or freedom fighter certificate.
- ii) Dependence certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner.

❖ **Sportsmen/Sportswomen**

- (a) 2%seats would be filled with sportsmen or sportswomen on the basis of their merits as per grading criteria forwarded by the Chandigarh Administration. **This category shall not be divided into UT Pool/General Pool.**

Benefits of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following categories of the students: -

- (i) Who passed their qualifying examination from colleges recognized by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said college, who have studied in Chandigarh colleges for at least two years before applying for gradation certificate subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh state etc. in the national / other recognized tournaments.

- (ii) Where Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/U.T.s on reciprocal basis to give benefits of reservation in admission in Sports Category in Chandigarh, **they will be graded as per existing policy of Chandigarh Administration.**
- (iii) Countersigning of Gradation certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that counter signed certificates will be graded as per policy of Chandigarh Administration.

The gradation for Sports person is as under, which should not be before 01.04.2022.

Gradation Certificate of Sports, which is issued by Sports Department of Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh only will be accepted.

NOTE: I Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only:

- (i) If his / her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in the Inter-College/Inter-University Tournaments laid down by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) rules.
- (ii) If his/her achievement in sports relates to his/her activity in any of the three years preceding admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2026-28, the achievements shall not be prior to the 01.04.2022 or as per the decision of the Chandigarh Administration)

❖ **Foreign students**

2%seats are reserved for foreign students in B.Ed. course. The foreign students should submit along with their application the following documents without which they will not be considered for admission under this category:

- (i) Eligibility Certificate: If a student is seeking admission on the basis of foreign qualification.
- (ii) Long term student Visa
- (iii) Proof of foreign Nationality

NOTE:

- (i) Foreign students residing abroad should apply through their respective Embassies to the Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.
- (ii) Foreign Students desirous of seeking admission to B.Ed. Course who is in India will compete amongst themselves for the seats created for them. Those living and applying from abroad shall be required to produce the test score of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) from Princeton USA. Foreign Candidates shall also have to comply with all the requirements of Government of India, Chandigarh U.T. Administration as well as Panjab University as prescribed by them from time to time. Admission of the foreign students to the college is governed by the guidelines issued by the Dean, Foreign Students, Panjab University, Chandigarh.

OVER AND ABOVE (Additional) SEATS:

- ❖ **Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) 10% over and above of the sanctioned seats*** (Specimen Performa attached in appendix-B)

*In compliance of letter vide the Home Department, Chandigarh Administration order no.19/1/3-IH(3) 2019/4185dated01/05/2019, endorsed by Director Higher Education vide Endst. No. 239-DHE-UT-Ad.II-26(11)2000-2003 dated 24.05.2019

- i. There is 10% reservation for the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) for admission to City Colleges over and above the sanctioned seats. The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) from all over India would get benefit of 10% reservation in seats over and above the sanctioned in take for Admission in the Educational /Technical /Medical Institutions of Union Territory, Chandigarh.
- ii. Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8 lakhs are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from

all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income: -

- i. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
 - ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities.
 - iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- iii. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed up on production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:
- (i) District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner
 - (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate / Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate.
 - (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
 - (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

The reservation policy and seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. In case seats in a reserved category remain vacant on account of non-availability of qualified candidates such seats may be filled up from the General category. The candidate who had applied for a reserved category will be considered for that particular category only.

This reservation is in accordance to the Home Policy of Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh.

Note: As and when there is a change in the Home Policy or University rules, it will be incorporated in the admission policy and intimated to the students and displayed on the notion board also

4. GENERAL CONDITIONS:-

- i) Admission will be purely on the basis of common merit list under respective pools.
- ii) The University will notify the last date for submission of application forms for the admission and counseling.
- iii) The reservation of seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. However, in case of seats in a reserved category remain vacant; on account of non-availability of qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up from the general category candidates.
- iv) After first admission counseling if any scheduled Tribe seat remains vacant then any candidate from ST category can claim the seat irrespective of the pool on the basis of the merit of the Entrance examination.
- v) The admission of total number of seats in the colleges of education for candidates belonging to different subjects will be done as per the norms laid down by the NCTE (N&S) dated 27-11-2014.
- vi) Candidates applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for **ONLY ONE CATEGORY** in the admission form to be submitted to the University in the first instance before the counseling.
- vii) **NO CHANGE OF CATEGORY OR POOL WILL BE ENTERTAINED/PERMITTED AT A LATER STAGE IN THE APPLICATION FORM.**
- viii) The allocation of college will be made through **Centralized Offline counseling** by the Panjab University, Chandigarh.
- ix) The counseling schedule will be prepared by the admission committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor of the University.
- x) All seats in the B.Ed. (General), B.Ed. (Yoga) and B.Ed.(Special Education) Intellectual Disabilities course in the Colleges of Chandigarh shall ensure that:
 - i. Eligible candidates are required to produce certificates in original of the educational record and eligibility at the time of counseling. In case candidates are unable to submit their original certificates, they will not be considered for admission to the counseling irrespective of the merit to entitlement.
 - ii. In Counseling only the major subject would be allotted by the University. The minor subject would be allotted by the college. Allocation of seat does not mean confirmation of admission.
 - iii. The admission will be confirmed by the college concerned after checking and verification of documents.
- xi) **After completion of counseling the admission committee will take decision about filling of unfilled seats. The method proposed would be in light of the decisions taken by the Punjab and Haryana High Court regarding C.W.P. No. 19518 dated 14.12.2009. The admission committee would fill all the seats subject to the availability of eligible candidates.**
- xii) It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that correct information is provided when the form is filled online.
 - xiii) Any incorrect information will lead to disqualification.
 - xiv) Checking/Verification of the certificates/documents of the allotted candidates would be the responsibility of the concerned college.
 - xv) The University shall submit the complete list of admitted candidates to the undersigned with a copy to the Director, Higher Education, and Chandigarh Administration within one month of the completion of admission process.

5. FEES & FUNDS:

For admission to private self-financed B.Ed. Colleges the fee and funds structure will be according to the instructions issued by the Chandigarh Administration from time to time.

6. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Panjab University, Chandigarh

shall be final.

7. Coordinator of B.Ed. admissions shall ensure that all the seats in all colleges of education be got filled and the necessary permission from higher authorities, if required may be obtained will in time.
8. **The Schedule for B.Ed. Admissions will be notified/published by the Panjab University, Chandigarh and the admission process of the B.Ed. Courses for the session 2026-28 is completed by 30th September 2026 in all respect.**

B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. or an equivalent degree at graduate level depending on the requirements of being the school subject for pedagogical courses, can take admissions to B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability). In this course, a candidate has to select any two school teaching subjects during the course of study, i.e. language (Hindi, English & Punjabi) and school subjects (Science, Math& Social Sciences). All Admissions will be done as per the Reservation Policies of Union Territory of Chandigarh and Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- xxi. The admission and allocation of college will be made through face to face/ Offline counseling by the authorized committee. The candidate should appear before the counseling committee in physical / face to face mode. The offline counseling schedule will be notified by the University from time to time.

- I. The result of the Common Entrance Test (CET) shall, *ipso facto*, not entitle a candidate to get admission in an institution/ department/ centre concerned where he/she intends to seek admission. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to make sure about his/her eligibility and fulfillment of such other conditions as may be prescribed for admission in the rules and regulations of University / Institution concerned. Merely because a candidate is allowed to appear in the Common Entrance Test (CET) does not mean that he/she is eligible and his/ her appearance therein will not stop or debar the university/ institution concerned from satisfying itself about his/her eligibility at any subsequent stage.
- II. Notwithstanding anything contained in this booklet, the eligibility conditions for admission to the B.Ed. Course shall be governed by the Regulations / rules as enshrined in the Calendar of the Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- Instructions / Notifications issued by the Chandigarh Administration and N.C.T.E. (National Council for Teacher Education), will be applicable.
- III. The Common Entrance Test (CET) will be held on **12-07-2026 (Sunday)** from 10.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon.
- IV. There will be one paper of 100 marks and paper contains five parts (Part A to Part E).
- V. **Part A, B, C & D are compulsory consisting of 20 marks each. Part E is optional, candidates shall opt one language out of Hindi or Punjabi. The candidate shall carefully fill (darken the correct bubble corresponding to the opted language i.e. Hindi or Punjabi) in the OMR sheet. Part E consist is of 20marks.**
- VI. **Part E will not be evaluated in case the candidate does not fill any of the language option (Hindi or Punjabi) or fill both of the language option. The candidate shall be responsible for not following the instructions carefully.**
- VII. **There will be no negative marking.**
- VIII. The candidate has to report at Test Centre 30 minutes before the start of Test.
- IX. The medium of examination in respect of Question Booklets shall be in English, Hindi and Punjabi medium except for Language Proficiency Test which shall be set in the respective Languages. However, there will be single OMR sheet.
- X. **Special arrangements for amanuensis (writer of answer):**
i. A candidate may be allowed help of an amanuensis(writer) if he/she is: Blind
ii. Permanently disabled from writing with his/ her own hand.
OR
iii. Temporarily disabled from writing on account of fracture of the right or left arm, forearm or dislocation of a shoulder elbow or wrist etc. The candidate shall produce a certificate from a Professor of the specialty concerned of a Medical College and where there is no Medical College, from the Chief Medical officer of the district concerned to the effect that the candidate is unable to write his/ her answer-books because of the temporary disablement.
- XI. **40 minutes extra would be given to the visually handicapped/persons with disability (PwD).**
- XII. The candidates shall be required to answer the questions only on the OMR sheet provided for the purpose, strictly as per instructions given on the title page of the question booklet and OMR sheet.
- XIII. There will be four options specified against each question i.e. A, B, C, and D out of which only one is correct. The candidate shall fill only one of the bubbles marked A or B or C or D against the relevant question using Black ball pen only.
- XIV. The OMR Sheet is designed for computer evaluation. Please follow the instructions given on the answer sheet so that computer evaluates it correctly.
- XV. For making answers, use **Black pen only**. The shading should be dark enough and should fill the bubble completely so that letter / number inside it is not visible.
- XVI. Each question has four choices labeled as A, B, C, and D. Select only one Choice you think is the best response and darken the bubble bearing it.
- XVII. Every candidate is required to hand over both the OMR Answer Sheet and the Question Booklet to the Centre Superintendent/Invigilator when the time allowed for the Common Entrance Test (CET) is over, even if she / he has not attempted any question. No page / part of the Question Booklet / OMR

- XVIII. The use of calculators is not allowed.
- XIX. No candidate shall be allowed to leave the examination hall / room before the expiry of the time allotted for the respective paper.

- XXI. Any candidate who carries any telecommunication equipment such as pager, cellular phone, wireless set, Bluetooth device and smart watch etc. inside the examination hall shall be expelled from the examination hall & disqualified.
- XXII. The candidates must bring their own stationary items such as **Black Ball Pen**. Borrowing of material inside the Test Centre is strictly prohibited.

- XXV. Candidates are not allowed to carry eatables, drinks etc. into the Test Centre. Smoking inside and around the Centre is not permitted.
- XXVI. Any candidate who creates disturbance of any kind during examination or otherwise misbehaves in or around the examination hall or refuses to obey the Superintendent / Deputy Superintendent / Assistant Superintendent / any other official on examination duty or changes his/her seat with any other candidate or occupies any seat, other than the one allotted to him/her shall be expelled from the examination hall. ("Expulsion" for this purpose would mean cancellation of the Entire Entrance Test). The Centre Superintendent / Observer / any other authorized University Officer / Official shall be competent to expel a candidate from the examination centre.
- XXVII. Any candidate having in his/her possession or accessible to him/her paper/books or notes which may possibly be of any assistance to him/her or is found giving or receiving assistance, or copying from any paper/book or note or from anywhere else or allowing any other candidate to copy from his/her answer book or found writing on any other paper, questions set in the question paper, during examination or using or attempting to use any other unfair means or indulging in any kind of misconduct shall be expelled from the examination hall. ("Expulsion" for this purpose would mean cancellation of the Entire Entrance Test). The Centre Superintendent/Observer/any other authorized University Officer / Official shall be competent to expel a candidate from the examination centre.
- XXVIII. If any Answer Sheet of a candidate shows or it is otherwise established that he/she has received or attempted to receive help from any source in any manner or has given help or attempted to give help to any other candidate in any manner, the relevant Answer Sheet shall be cancelled. The cancellation of the Answer Sheet shall mean cancellation of all Answer Sheets of the Common Entrance Test. The decision of the advisory committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh in this regard shall be final.

- XXIX. If a candidate writes his/her name or puts any kind of identification mark or discloses his/her identity by any method whatsoever on the cover or anywhere else in the Question Booklet / Answer Sheet, the same shall be treated as cancelled. The cancellation of the Answer Sheet shall mean cancellation of all Answer Sheets of the Common Entrance Test (CET). The decision of the Controller of Examinations, Panjab University, Chandigarh in this regard shall be final.
- XXX. Any person, who impersonates a candidate, shall be disqualified from appearing in any Panjab University examination for a period of five years including this Common Entrance Test (CET), if that person is a student on the rolls of a recognised School or College or University. But if the person is not on the rolls of a recognised School or College or University, s/he shall be declared as a person not fit and proper to be admitted to any examination of the Panjab University for a period of 5 years. The case, if necessary, shall also be reported to the police for any further action in the matter.
- XXXI. If it is found that a candidate has knowingly or willfully concealed or suppressed any information / fact which renders him/her ineligible to take the Common Entrance Test (CET), his / her result of the Test as also admission to an Institution / Department / Centre of the University, if granted, shall stand cancelled and he / she shall have no claim whatsoever against the Institution / Department / Centre concerned and the case, if necessary shall be reported to the police.
- XXXII. If a dispute or controversy of any kind arises before, during or after conduct of Common Entrance Test (CET), the decision of the advisory committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh, in all such cases, shall be final.
- XXXIII. The candidates shall be admitted to the test only on the production of the Admit Card along with photo Identity card / proof at the Test Centre. No candidate shall be allowed to take the test without the Admit Card under any circumstances. The candidates must retain the Admit Card with them till the admission process is over, since it will be required again at the time of counselling.
- XXXIV. The Admit Cards will be issued to the candidates only provisionally, at their sole risk and responsibility subject to the final confirmation of their eligibility at the time of admission. It is further clarified that the candidates shall be taking the test at their own risk and responsibility as far as their eligibility is concerned and the University shall, in no way, be responsible if they are found to be ineligible, later, leading to cancellation of their result or any other consequence(s) emanating from the same.
- XXXV. The result related information of the Common Entrance Test (CET) will be made available at (<http://results.puexam.in>)
- XXXVI. The date by which admit Card will be available online is mentioned in the counseling schedule. PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST

The Merit list will be prepared in following manner:

- i. The minimum qualifying marks in B.Ed.-CET-2026 will be 25% for General Category students and 20% for SC/ST/ PwD candidates.
- ii. Quota-wise, Category-wise and Course wise Merit lists will be prepared.

RESOLVING OF TIES

When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria:

- i. Candidate with higher percentage of marks in lower qualifying degree.
- ii. Candidate older in age shall rank higher in the order of merit.
